THE BRITISH LOGIC COLLOQUIUM

Registered Charity No. 275541

- 1. Name. The name of the Society shall be The British Logic Colloquium.
- 2. Objects. The object of the Society shall be to advance the education of the public within Great Britain and Northern Ireland in the study of formal or mathematical logic and other subjects in so far as they relate to such logic and in furtherance of that object but not further or otherwise the Society shall have the following powers: -
 - (i) holding meetings as it sees fit;
 - (ii) publishing such proceedings, journals or other material as it sees fit;
 - (iii) supporting education relating to formal or mathematical logic;
 - (iv) co-operating with other national or international charitable institutions or groups with similar aims.
- 3. Membership. Membership shall be open to all persons who support the objects of the Society, on payment of an annual subscription; provided that persons whose membership has been terminated under rule 13 may only be re-admitted to membership with the approval of the Committee.
- 4. Subscription. The annual subscription shall be determined by the committee, which may vary the amount for students or for other categories of members. It shall be due on January 1st each year. A member shall not have the right to vote in any ballot if his or her subscription is in arrears, and any member whose subscription is more than twelve months in arrears shall be deemed to have resigned.
- 5. Officers. The Society shall have a president, a vice-president, a secretary and a treasurer, and any other officers which the committee shall decide.
- 6. Committee. There shall be a committee of seven full members, consisting of the president, the vice-president, the secretary, the treasurer, and three other full members.
 - Subject to the constitution and to any resolutions passed by the membership under rule 12 below, the committee shall be responsible for running the Society, for directing the use of its funds in accord with the objects of the Society, for determining the annual subscription, and for making decisions on behalf of the Society.

It may appoint sub-committees, and co-opt members to the committee who shall not have the right to vote.

The quorum for decisions of the committee shall be one-half of the full members.

- 7. *Elections*. The president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, and other full members of the committee shall be elected by a ballot of the members. The procedure for nomination and voting shall be as follows.
 - (i) The committee, or any two members, may nominate any member or members for any vacancies for which an election is to be held. The committee may require the consent of any nominee in writing.
 - (ii) Before any election, the committee shall set a final date for nominations (normally 31st October), giving at least three weeks' notice of that date to the members.
 - (iii) If more than one nomination is received for any vacancy, a ballot containing all such nominations shall be sent to each members, giving at least two weeks' notice of the date by which they must be returned (normally 30th November). The committee shall communicate to members the results of the ballot.
 - (iv) Full members of the committee shall be elected for a term not exceeding three years. If the place of any full member of the committee shall fall vacant before his or her term of election has expired, an election shall be held within twelve months to fill the remainder of the term only.

- 8. Representatives. The committee may appoint representatives of the Society to any other appropriate body.
- 9. Report. The committee shall circulate an annual report and a treasurer's report to the members.
- 10. General Meetings. A general meeting shall normally be held in each calendar year, at which the accounts for the previous year are submitted for approval. The agenda shall be circulated not later than two weeks before the meeting. The minutes and approved accounts shall be circulated to members not later than four weeks after the meeting. If in any year no general meeting is held, or the accounts not approved, they shall be resubmitted for approval at the next general meeting.

11. Recall.

- (i) Any officer, committee member, or member appointed by the committee in any capacity, may be removed from that office or appointment by a recall motion approved by two-thirds of the members voting. Such a recall shall be held if the committee decides, or within 60 days of the receipt by the secretary of a request signed by ten members of the Society. The vote shall be done by a ballot of the members, giving at least two weeks' notice of the date by which ballots must be returned.
- (ii) A member appointed to any position by the committee may be removed from the position by a vote of not less than five full members of the committee.
- 12. Changes and Membership Decisions. Resolutions binding on the Society and the committee, including constitutional amendments, may only be made by a ballot of the members and shall require a two-thirds majority of those voting. At least two weeks shall be allowed for the return of ballots.
 - Any resolution supported by the signatures of ten members must be put to the members within 60 days; providing that no resolution may be put which would cause the Society to cease to be a charity-at-law.
- 13. Expulsion. The committee shall terminate the membership of any person who, in its opinion, is opposing or hindering the objects or working of the Society; provided that such a person shall have the right to attend and be heard by the committee before such a decision is taken, except when the member's subscription is in arrears. Such a person shall only be re-admitted to membership with the approval of the committee.
- 14. Notice to Members. In determining the period of notice which has been given to members by the committee on any matter, the date on which the communication was sent shall be used.
- 15. Dissolution. If this Society shall decide to disband, any remaining assets shall be applied towards charitable purposes of a like nature, such as The British Society for the Philosophy of Science, The London Mathematical Society.
